Here are some handy hints to help ensure your bin is emptied each week:

- Take your bin out the evening before pick up
- Place your bin 1m from cars or other obstructions
- Leave a 50cm gap minimum between bins
- Make sure it's not too heavy (maximum weight is 80kg)
- Don't place heavy items, grass clippings or liquids in your bin
