Wentworth Aerodrome soars to new heights

In May 2019, Council was successful in securing Restart NSW Infrastructure funding for the upgrade of the Wentworth Aerodrome to provide an all-weather, 24 hour access facility with the capacity for Code 2B aircraft. The upgrade includes the construction of a new sealed runway, taxiway and apron, aircraft parking areas and the installation of pilot activated lighting.

These works will support the rural and remote emergency and air freight networks, cater for larger charter aircraft used by the mining and government sectors, as well as cater to air charter tours for international and domestic visitors. This will enable better access to Mungo National Park and other tourist attractions in the area.

Wentworth Shire on the move

Wentworth Shire is on the move with 15 development applications determined in October 2020 under delegated authority by the Director Health and Planning.

The estimated value of the determined developments was \$1,627,002. This brings the year to date total to 138 Development Applications and 31 S4.55 Applications approved, with an estimated development value of \$29,082,013.
