Transfer station opening hours

Wentworth Transfer Station will remain open on Wednesdays 9:00am to 1:00pm, Friday 1:00pm to 4:30pm and Sundays 9:00am to 2:00pm. Dareton Transfer Station is closed on Tuesdays and open on Thursdays and Saturdays from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Buronga Landfill is open Monday to Friday 8:00am until 4:45pm and Saturday and Sunday 9:00am to 4:45pm.

Pomona Landfill is open Friday 9:00am to 12:00pm.

Financial assistance granted

Council granted seven requests for financial assistance at its February Meeting.

The requests totalled \$14,571.93, leaving a balance of \$62,853.77 for the remainder of 2021.

The requests granted were:

- \$46 to the OMRV Play Group to refund the hire fee of the Pooncarie Hall
- \$2000 to the Wentworth Rowing Club to go towards the Annual Easter Regatta
- \$1760.38 to Dareton Men In A Shed for the purchase of a defibrillator and attachments

- \$5000 to the Sunraysia Motor Sports Club Inc to go towards the Desert Dash 500 Off Road Racing Event being held in Pooncarie on 16-18 April
- A \$389.75 rate reduction for the Wentworth District Pre School Play Centre
- \$375.80 to the Wentworth District Pre School Play Centre to be put towards the 2020/21 annual public liability charges
- \$5000 to the Wentworth District Community Medical Centre Inc towards extensive promotional material to support the need for critical health infrastructure in the Wentworth township.

Dareton strategy to be displayed

Council has endorsed a draft strategy for the township of Dareton to go out on public display for 28 days. 'Our Town, Our Future - Dareton Revitalised' aims to revitalise the township while ensuring future development of the area is well planned and sustainable for servicing the needs of the current and future community.

Monthly finances in check

Council's rates and charges collections for the month of January were \$222,363.23. After allowing for pensioner subsidies, the total levies collected are now 60.96%. For comparison purposes 60.45% of the levy had been collected at the end of January 2020.
