DARETON LOOKS FORWARD

Wentworth Shire Council's draft 'Our Town, Our Future – Dareton Revitalised' strategy aims to revitalize the township of Dareton and the wider Coomealla district and ensure its future is secure and well planned now and in the future. The draft strategy is on public exhibition until April 9 after councillors endorsed its release at the February meeting of Council.

Wentworth Shire Council Mayor Susan Nichols said the community feedback highlighted just how much pride the people of Dareton take in their town. "The Dareton community is one that is incredibly proud about the place they live and this strategy will ensure they can take ownership of its future," Cr Nichols said. "It is exciting to see in an age where small rural townships have historically been in decline that the Dareton community is really passionate about making sure it won't be one of those townships."

Meeting mentions

Next council meeting date amended

Wentworth Shire Council's next Ordinary Meeting will be held on 14 April 2021 from 10:00am at the Midway Centre in Buronga. This change, bringing the meeting forward seven days, will allow Councillors to attend the Western Division of Councils conference in Broken Hill from 19-21 April 2021. At the February 2021 meeting it was resolved that six Councillors attend the Western Division of Councils Conference.

New development planning portal

In September 2019, a Secretary order was released by the NSW Government requiring that all concurrence and referrals as part of a Development Application from Council to other agencies must be done through the Planning Portal. This was the first part of a process by the NSW State Government to move all Development Applications onto the portal. From 1 January 2021 applicants were able to lodge Development Applications through the portal. Council can still lodge Development Applications received through other mediums (e-mail or hardcopy files over the counter). From 1 July 2021, all Development Applications including Section 4.55 Modification Applications must be lodged with Council through the planning portal.

Council will be unable to accept a Development Application lodged through other mediums (e-mail or hardcopy files over the counter).

Development continuing

For the month of February 2021, a total of eight Development Applications and four S4.55 Modification Applications were determined under delegated authority by the Director Health and Planning.

The estimated value of the determined developments was \$1,201,370.00. This brings the year to date total to nine Development Applications and five S4.55 Applications approved, with an estimated development value of \$1,212,370.00.

Council to advocate for water

Wentworth Shire Council will strongly advocate for the joining of Lake Cawndilla and the Darling River to supply water to the lower end of the Darling at May's Murray **Darling Association National** Conference. Council will also call for the NSW Government to prioritise connectivity through to the end of the system in all water sharing plans. The Murray Darling Association's 77th National Conference and Annual General Meeting is being held in

Wentworth from 16-19 May 2021.

Wentworth Aerodrome open during day

The Wentworth Aerodrome is now open for daytime traffic. The main runway (08/26) is operational, however the North-South runway (17/35) is still closed for ongoing works. Wentworth Shire Council advises there will be intermittent closures as the aerodrome redevelopment project continues. Aviators will be notified by NOTAM of any closures and pilots should check the Air Services website before any aerodrome use.
