


THE SECRETS OF DE COURCY SQUARE by Ann O'Loughlin

Written in vivid technicolour, with an electric daughter-grandmother relationship at its heart, this is a stunning debut novel about what happens when secrets fester through the generations.


A RIVER CALLED TIME by Courttia Newland

THE ZOOKEEPER OF BELFAST by S. Kirk Walsh



She becomes convinced that, despite his alibi, Edward Fosca is guilty of the murder. But why would the professor target one of his students? And why does he keep returning to the rites of Persephone and her journey to the underworld?

THE KILLING KIND by Jane Casey






YOU HAD IT COMING by B.M. Carroll

WHAT COULD BE SAVED by Liese O'Halloran Schwarz






THE LOST SUMMERS OF DRIFTWOOD by Vanessa McCausland F/MACC






In her 2010 memoir, Affection, Krissy Kneen introduced readers to her unique family and the towering matriarchal figure of her grandmother. When her grandmother died recently, Krissy finally felt at liberty to explore the questions that had nagged at her for so long. In The Three Burials of Lotty Kneen, Krissy sets out with a box containing her grandmother's ashes, intending to trace the old woman's early life in Slovenia and Egypt, and perhaps locate some remnants of family. Along the way she uncovers the extraordinary story of the colony of Slovene women who became the nannies of choice for the wealthy Italians of pre-war Alexandria, and identifies as best she can the places where Lotty's restless, demanding spirit will be at peace.

THE WOMEN'S DOC by Caroline de Costa

When Caroline first started in medicine, being an unmarried mother was frowned on, cane toads were used for pregnancy tests, and giving birth was much riskier than it is today. Her funny and poignant stories of bringing babies into the world show that, while much has changed, women still work hard and it remains a bloody business. A birth plan is no guarantee of a normal birth (whatever that is). Men have always wanted to control women's bodies, and Caroline has been instrumental in giving Australian women of all backgrounds the opportunity to resist, and to choose when and how they have babies. Her behind-the-scenes stories reveal it's often the little things that win a campaign.


THE WINDSOR DIARIES by Alathea Fitzalan Howard


