Development applications continue to roll in

For the month of November 2021, a total of 17 Development Applications and one S4.55 Modification Applications were determined under delegated authority by the Director Health and Planning.

The estimated value of the determined developments was \$3.687.880.00.

For the month of December 2021, a total of 10 Development Applications and three S4.55 Modification Applications were determined. The estimated value of the determined developments was \$2,344,720.00. This brought the 2021 year to date total to 194 Development Applications and 32 S4.55 Applications approved, with an estimated development value of \$32,708,057.00
