

Advice for parents of boarding school students who are isolated due to current flooding.

Are you needing to get your kids home from boarding school, but are isolated?

The New South Wales State Emergency Service is able to assist in getting your children home safely at the end of this school year.

The NSW SES is utilising helicopters and high-clearance vehicles to assist residents with resupply including food, medicines and vital supplies right across the flood-affected communities in NSW.

The service is also providing helicopter transfers for community members requiring emergency medical transport and who are isolated by floodwater.

Further to this, school children looking to get home from boarding school, or boarding houses if they are at a public school, will have access to helicopters on 9 and 16 December for a one-way trip home at the end of the school year.

Follow the flow-chart on the right on how we can assist you with transport of your children.

If you also need resupply of vital supplies during this prolonged flooding and isolation, please call us on 132 500 to get the ball rolling.



Families of students wanting to return home from school need to firstly call NSW SES on 132 500 and register a request for ONE-WAY transport in advance of transport flights on 9/12/22 and 16/2/22.

NSW SES will determine the closest community to the isolated property and will notify the family of the pick up location for helicopter.

Families organise students to be ready at the arranged pick up locations at the arranged and appropriate times and to collect students on arrival at drop off location.
