The 2022/23 financial year encountered project setbacks impacted by flooding and the re-allocation of staff resources, however projects and works in Wentworth Shire are now back on track with some exciting projects being completed in late 2023 and early 2024.

The Civic Centre is progressing well with the interior wall framing near completion. Expected opening 1 July 2024.

Willowbend Caravan Park suffered from the flood inundation, with the moisture levels in the soil still unsuitable for construction to commence.

Pooncarie Road road works have recommenced after 8 months of delays due to widespread flooding. Works are expected to be completed by Christmas 2023.

THE SMOKE SHOW BBQ & SMOKED MEATS FESTIVAL FIRES UP IN WENTWORTH

Around 5,000 attendees were fired up for The Smoke Show BBQ & Smoked Meats Festival on Saturday 8 July with an action-packed afternoon of entertainment and delicious smoked meats on offer.

The Smoke Show, a FREE event for all ages hosted by Wentworth Shire Council, has been marked a huge success for the Wentworth community. Wentworth Showgrounds proved to be a perfect location for the number of people at the event, after suffering from flood inundation during the 2022/23 flood period.

In the midst of the floods in February 2023, Wentworth Winedown was hosted at the Australian Inland Botanic Gardens after an original plan to be hosted at the Wentworth Showgrounds. Making use of the Community Pavilion and Showground facilities for the Smoke Show showed that Wentworth has excellent community facilities on offer to host future events.

The Smoke Show provided great live entertainment from local artists, whip cracking and smoking demonstrations, classic cars on display, mechanical bull riding and an assortment of kid's activities. Feeding the crowd of around 5,000 attendees were some of the best smoked and BBQ meat vendors from the local region as well as visiting vendors from Bendigo and Adelaide. One of the food vendors catered for 1,900 meals alone.

With increased numbers, the town was also buzzing with tourism with many searching the charming streets of Wentworth throughout the day.

Food vendors, traders, clubs and charities received an overwhelming amount of support with Wentworth Rowing Club drink purchases going towards the flood clean-up of their clubhouse. Variety The Children's Charity had their charity car on display and the Isolated Children's Parent's Association (ICPA) sold hot donuts to attendees. The event was an excellent opportunity to raise awareness and receive donations for those in need.

Wentworth Shire Council would like to thank attendees for their patience during the Smoke Show with parking and queuing. The interest for a Smoked Meats & BBQ festival is certainly there from the community and visitors alike.

NAMATJIRA RAW WATER STORAGE

On Wednesday 12 July 2023, Council was invited to the Aboriginal Communities Water and Sewerage Program (ACWSP) Namatjira Raw Water Tank Commissioning.

The tanks are part of a \$3 million upgrade to the raw water supply, funded by the NSW Planning and Environment Department with support from the Dareton Local Aboriginal Land Council (LALC), Wentworth Shire Council and NSW Public Works.

THE CELEBRATION

The celebration commenced with a Welcome to Country from Pam Handy, CEO of Dareton Local Aboriginal Land Services and followed by a smoking ceremony by Damien Kennedy and traditional music from Johnno Mitchell. Local Indigenous dancers from Shantelle Thompson Dancers – the Kiilalaana group portrayed the connection of the land and water through dance.

THE RAW WATER SYSTEM

The raw water system is sourced from the Murray River and pumped to the two (2x) two hundred and fifty-two thousand litre (252kl) steel reservoir raw water tanks. The pump station contains a fully remote SCADA system programmed to operate based on demand. Normal operation to provide raw water to the Namatjira

community typically has a flow rate of zero point seven (0.7) to two (2) litres per second. Firefighting operation is capable of delivering flowrates beyond twelve (12) litres per second. Council looks forward to maintaining this vital community infrastructure for the many years to come, with a projected design life being fifty (50) years.

THE ARTWORK

The spectacular artwork by local artists Johnno Mitchell, Jenny McCraken, Lorraine Mitchell, Sharon Kirby, Leo Uribe and Zest Artists is truly unique to this region.

The passion that has gone into the artwork shows the true beauty of the local land and stories of the community, in particular those of the connection to the land and meeting by the water.

The new pumping station mural shows local Aboriginal sporting heroes Jamie Lawson (AFL), Derek Eggmolesse-Smith (AFL) and Shantelle Thompson (Judo/martial arts champion). An excellent encouragement for the community aspirations in sports.

Showcasing local Aboriginal artist and Indigenous culture is extremely important for our region, further enhancing the progress of reconciliation within our communities.

PRAM RAMPS

Pram ramp works are underway across the shire, as part of the Wentworth Shire Council dedication to provide greater accessibility for the future (Disability Inclusion Plan 2022-2026).

The aim is to provide safer access at road crossings for pedestrians, prams and mobility vehicle users.

These works are funded from internal footpath repair budgets however grant opportunities are constantly being monitored for potential footpath projects.

In terms of safety, concrete typically performs better over the life of the asset.

Future works will be scheduled once inspections are undertaken and project priorities are assessed.



DID YOU KNOW?

The "grade" is an important concept in engineering design and applies to a variety of assets - especially in relation to pram ramps.

It can be known as profile, slope, pitch or "rise-over-run". Grade of pram ramps typically are up to 2.5% (can be 12.5% over short distances). To put it into perspective; Ranfurly Way down Pump Hill in Merbein is 8.4%!







REQUEST FOR SPONSORSHIP



Wentworth Shire Council has been granted more than \$2 million under the New South Wales Resources for Regions program to deliver infrastructure improvements and programs across the shire.


Wood Street/Gol Gol North Road from Burns Street to Kingfisher Road ~476m in length, 2m width

Pine Road from Wood Street to Subdivision connection ~230m in length

Wood Street, Gol Gol from Dawn Avenue to King Street ~600m in length, 2.5m width







James King Park

Wentworth Shire Council is about to undergo a \$400,000 upgrade across two reserves comprising of a new retaining wall, upgraded stairs and paths at James King Park in Gol Gol.



POONCARIE ROAD \$9.2 MILLION ALL WEATHER ACCESS UPGRADE

Wentworth Shire Council has recommenced road works on Pooncarie Road (Wentworth Shire) after 8 months of delays due to widespread flooding.

The \$9.2 million project is jointly funded on a 50:50 basis with the Australian Government and NSW Government under the Growing Local Economies Fund with Office of Regional Development.

Planned improvements include 26km of new seal, allowing road users to access the road in all weather conditions and removing over 600km of road detours when the road is impacted by wet weather-related road closures.

Works are expected to be completed by Christmas 2023.



ROAD CLOSED

WENTWORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL OVAL SEWER WORKS - EXTENDED

Arthur Street, Francis Street & Darling Lane, Wentworth

The existing Arthur Street closure from Adam Street to Darling Street has been extended a further two weeks.

Additionally, Francis Street will be closed to all traffic from Adam Street to Darling Street for a one week period.

Darling Lane will be accessible to Local Traffic only.

The closure is to enable the sewer construction at the Wentworth Primary School oval. The works are expected to be completed 5:00pm, Friday 4 August.

WENTWORTH WINTER ART FEST

Adelaide Street will be closed from the river to John Egge Lane, leaving the U-turn point free for cars to turn around.



WENTWORTH SHIRE ROAD CONDITIONS

Wentworth Shire Council provides and maintains an extensive road network.

Covering an area of 2,626,926 hectares (26,000 sq km), the network consists of over sealed (599km) and unsealed (1,429km) road.

Road crews are committed to planning ahead to complete road and traffic upgrades to create an integrated traffic network that meets demands.

Regular road health checks and scheduled maintenance works are carried out to ensure the road network is safe and accessible for motorists.
