EXERCISE 'BALLET'

Emergency services in Wentworth Shire tested their skills on Wednesday 16 August at Wentworth Aerodrome while undertaking 'Exercise Ballet'. The multi-agency emergency management exercise was conducted by Wentworth Shire LEMC with the aim of testing the capability, cooperation, coordination and communication between rescue agencies within the footprint of the Wentworth Shire LGA.

In accordance with the Wentworth Aerodrome Emergency Plan, emergency services were put to the test in response to a simulated airport emergency and rescue incident. Participants of the simulation included; NSW Police Force, NSW Ambulance, Fire and Rescue NSW, NSW Rural Fire Service and Sunraysia Collaboration with the Broken Hill University Department of Rural Health.

The simulated emergency scenario involved an aircraft with two occupants that had failed to land safely on the tarmac at Wentworth Aerodrome. As a result of the impact, the occupants are trapped with a minor fuel spill surrounding the aircraft.

Role playing as the trapped occupants were nursing students Sam and Luci from Sunraysia Collaboration with the Broken Hill University Department of Rural Health.

The objectives of the exercise were to; test the Wentworth Aerodrome Emergency Plan, to test the response of emergency services to an emergency at Wentworth Aerodrome, to test the call out procedures for an emergency at Wentworth Aerodrome and to test the interagency communication at a rescue.

General Manager of Wentworth Shire Council, Mr. Ken Ross observed the exercise as LEMO-Support Exercise Director and was pleased with the response and coordination amongst the emergency services teams.






Arumpo Road Reconstruction and Upgrade


Arumpo Road will receive a 24.52km upgrade in 2024. The \$6.25 million project is jointly funded by Wentworth Shire Council and the Australian Federal Government as part of the Remote Roads Upgrade Pilot Program.

The project will include a survey and design, earthworks to reinstate formation and improve drainage, 150mm sub-base overlaid with 150mm basecourse, two coat bitumen seal and line marking.



The project is due to commence in March 2024, with an estimated completion by November 2024.





Key features of the project:

- New 2.5 metre wide asphalt sharedway from the intersection of Hawdon Street and Tapio Street to Namatjira Avenue following the existing alignment.
- Widening of existing section of concrete path between Pump Station Road and Tallawalla Road.
- Installation of solar lighting along the length of the sharedway.
- Installation of bench seating along sharedway

Expected outcomes:

- Upgrade of existing facility to improve useful life and amenity.
- Improved safety for sharedway users.

Funded by: \$528,000 - Get NSW Active 2023/24

This project is expected to be completed by 30 June 2024.



Junction Island Bridge Upgrade

Key features of the project:


The new Junction Island Bridge will provide wheelchair suitable access to Junction Island.

The bridge will have clearance to the water level to allow continued movement between the Murray and Darling Rivers by small craft.

Expected outcomes:

- Improved community access to Junction Island.
- Improved amenity of the Ski Reserve public area.
- Improved safety for access to Junction Island.

Funded by: \$300,000 - Resources for Regions - Round 7






Buronga Pump Track Stage 2

Key features of the project:

Adjacent to the Buronga Pump Track, Stage 2 will look to continue on from Stage 1 of the Pump Track by providing the community with a more advanced course.

Expected outcomes:

The works will include additional asphalt tracks in the Buronga Riverfront area, new toilet amenities and minor landscaping will also be undertaken to link back to Stage 1.



Project completion anticipated by early 2025

Funded by: \$400,000 - Resources for Regions - Round 9



ROAD CLOSURES

Darling Street, Wharf Street & Adelaide Street, Wentworth

An upcoming event is set to be held in a section of Darling Street, Wentworth.

'Country Music Festival Twilight Event' will be held on Friday 29 September from 3:30pm -7:30pm. Street closures will be in effect from 2:30pm - 8:30pm.

Logistics for this event will require a section of Darling Street, Wharf Street and Adelaide Street to be closed for the above mentioned time and date

Closures include:

- Darling Street from the Darling and Sandwych Street intersection to Willowbend Caravan Park.
- Wharf Street at the Darling Street intersection.
- Adelaide Street from the river to John Egge Lane, leaving the U-turn point free for cars to turn around.



WENTWORTH SHIRE ROAD CONDITIONS

Wentworth Shire Council provides and maintains an extensive road network.

Covering an area of 2,626,926 hectares (26,000 sq km), the network consists of over sealed (599km) and unsealed (1,429km) road.

Road crews are committed to planning ahead to complete road and traffic upgrades to create an integrated traffic network that meets demands.

Regular road health checks and scheduled maintenance works are carried out to ensure the road network is safe and accessible for motorists.

The estimated value of the determined developments was \$1,607,120.00. This brings the year to date total to sixty-six (66) Development Applications and twenty-one (21) \$4.55 Applications approved, with an estimated development value of \$10,671,906.00.
